Opportunities and Threats in Contemporary International Business

Ideas and ambitions for business careers appear relatively rarely among International Relations students in their early plans during undergraduate studies. However, their proficient knowledge of foreign languages, a good understanding of the international business (IB) environment as well as ability to recognize and address the changes and risks of global operation often lead them to work in international business after graduation.

Having acquired extensive knowledge and experience in IB practice, they often return to our lecture rooms, where they share their expertise with the new generations of students in IB classes. In recent years, we have captured some of their success stories (along with the lessons learned along the way) in video cases. These are shared internationally as part of the digital library of video cases on international business called *MNC Whispering* that has resulted from the Erasmus+ VCL4IB project. As case-based learning is one of the key teaching approaches in IB but also in other courses in our International Relations study programme, we will host our partners at a warming-up panel of the international conference celebrating 60 years of teaching and researching International Relations in Slovenia titled “Six Decades of the Past, Six Decades for the Future», where they will share their experience in IB.

The panelists will discuss the most recent risks and opportunities in the rapidly changing international business environment, such as those related to the Covid-19 pandemic and the rise of fake news. They will also share their experience of how MNEs and their managers learn and develop knowledge as well as how they attract, develop and retain talents. The discussion will also focus on the value of case-based learning for IB problem-solving. The guests will thereby offer recommendations for teachers and students wishing to pursue an IB career path in terms of knowledge and skill development.
