### The main objectives of the programme

The main objective is the employment profile of a social information specialist who:

- is able to manage and carry out projects requiring the identification, theoretical analysis and critical evaluation of ICT-related social processes/phenomena; in particular Internet technologies, in terms of understanding their characteristics in the design, development and implications of their use;
- is able to evaluate, analyse and plan digital services in the various social environments that are inseparable from complex (especially internet-based) ICTs;
- is skilled in the substantive but technically (computationally) demanding analysis of the growing volume of (quantitative) data in modern societies;

- can work collaboratively within organisations to achieve goals more effectively, taking into account the multiple (societal, individual) aspects of ICT use, and can lead projects in digital service design and/or data analytics.

The key expected learning outcomes for both modules are:

- Analysis and evaluation of contemporary ICTs as socio-technical systems, and identification of the role and trends of digital services in different socio-cultural contexts.
- Synthesis of the theoretical background and formulation of hypotheses in the analysis of the role of ICTs in society.
- Critical evaluation of ICTs in terms of their societal implications and guidelines for further development.
- Basic statistical analysis of different types of data using modern software tools.
- Understanding and evaluating research approaches, methods and data, and developing research agendas in the field of social informatics.
- Use of ethically acceptable social science research methods that incorporate digital technologies (e.g. data privacy and security on the internet).

Additional expected learning outcomes for the Data Analytics module are:

- Design, implementation and interpretation of complex statistical analyses and data mining.
- Design and implementation of reporting automation in data analytics.
- Assessing the suitability and justifying the choice of different methods for data analysis and visualisation.
- Understanding, collecting and evaluating the quality of big data.
- Advanced evaluation of the use of digital technologies in social science research.

Additional expected learning outcomes for the Digital Service Design module are:

- Applying and evaluating methods for user experience research in ICT and digital service design.
- Applying social process theory to the management of online communities, analysing their social structures and processes.
- Application, evaluation, and synthesis of tools and techniques for designing interactive technologies.
- Knowledge of the factors and guidelines in the design and project implementation of a web presence.
- Design and analysis of business plans and market potential for ICT-enabled marketing and advertising.

### General competences (learning outcomes)

Ability to think and reason abstractly and logically. Scientific scepticism, criticality. Ability to act professionally and ethically. Ability to work independently, collaboratively and in teams, and to communicate interpersonally. Project management and decision-making skills. Ability to communicate verbally and in writing in your area of expertise. Ability to design and deliver independent presentations in business contexts. Ability to formulate, present and critically evaluate the potential of innovative (business) ideas. Digital literacy for smart use of social media (reading, writing, interacting in groups, creating videos...). Ability to apply knowledge creatively to concrete examples.

Understanding the relationship between theory and experience (data). Understanding the complexity of interconnections between phenomena in the social sciences. Ability to analytically link research objectives with appropriate research approaches.

## Course-specific competences (learning outcomes)

**Both modules have the following competences in common:** - Understanding and identification of paradigms, theories, indicators and current global developments in the field of ICT and in society. - Ability to independently formulate a theoretical framework, explanatory model, hypotheses and an empirical test to explain a selected Internet phenomenon. - Ability to take an analytical approach to the management, leadership and implementation of projects related to the information society in terms of content or implementation. - Ability to design, conduct and implement empirical research that focuses on or involves social aspects of digital or Internet services. - Statistical literacy and ability to use computer-based statistical methods in data analytics. - Knowledge of standards for the publication of statistics and analysis results in the field of Social Informatics.

**Additional course-specific competences of the Data Analytics module:** - Application of data management and visualisation principles. - Analysis, interpretation, discovery of meaning in data. - Application of data mining. - Application of statistical tools for data analysis and visualisation. - Ability to design sophisticated analyses in the field of data analysis and visualisation. - Ability to discover (social) networks and analyse them with modern methods for (large) network analysis. - Application and critical evaluation of digital technologies in social science research.

**Additional course-specific competences of the Digital Service Design module:** - Ability to be active on the Internet at technical and digital content production level. - Ability to analytically identify trends in the development of digital services. - Knowledge of the principles of designing online communities and of moderating and analysing the social processes within them. - Ability to identify and apply the appropriate approach, tools and techniques for user involvement (especially user experience research) in the different stages of the process of research and development of digital services and interactive technologies. - Knowledge of and ability to apply a range of user experience analysis methods and quality assurance approaches for digital services, taking into account usability standards. - Ability to plan, organise and manage interdisciplinary team projects in the field of user-centred design, user experience research and web performance (re)design.

## Conditions for enrolment

The Master's programme in Social Informatics is open for enrolment to students who have completed:

- a) a study programme of at least undergraduate level, evaluated by at least 180 credits in the following fields of study: social sciences, journalism and information, business and administrative sciences, educational sciences and teacher education, mathematics and statistics, computer science, humanities, law, technical sciences, production technologies, architecture and civil engineering, health, social work, personal services and environmental protection, or an equivalent study programme obtained in accordance with the existing regulations in the Republic of Slovenia or abroad;
- b) a study programme of at least undergraduate level, evaluated by at least 180 credits in other fields of study, or an equivalent study programme obtained in accordance with the existing regulations in the Republic of Slovenia or abroad, provided that the student has completed the study requirements that are essential for the continuation of his/her studies, prior to enrolment. These obligations are determined by the Vice-Dean for the field of study, and range from 10 to a maximum of 60 credits.

## Selection criteria in the event of restricted enrolment

The selection of candidates is based on:

- success in undergraduate studies (average grade) – 50% points
- the grade obtained in the oral selective exam in the field to which the study programme belongs is also taken into account – 50% points.

## Criteria for the recognition of knowledge and skills acquired before enrolment in the programme

The study programme may recognise knowledge acquired through formal, non-formal or experiential learning, which may be recognised as part of the fulfilled study obligation. Recognition is based on certificates and other relevant documents or supporting documents. ## Grading methods

The grading methods comply with the [UL Statute](#) and are specified in the syllabuses.

## Conditions for advancing through the programme

Advancing to a higher year of study is possible with at least 51 credits in the current year (without a special application). However, in exceptional circumstances (as defined in the UL Statute), students who have accrued at least 42 credits in the current year of study may be admitted to the higher year of study on the basis of an approved application.

## Conditions for transferring between programmes

Transfers between programmes are governed by the applicable laws and regulations. The decision on the transfer shall be based on the application, the student's written request, the certificate of the fulfilment of the study obligations of the studies up to the time of application and the approved syllabuses of the courses, whereby the following criteria shall be taken into account: - the meeting of conditions for enrolment in the study programme, - the number of available places for enrolment, - the applicants are transferring from a study programme which, at the end of their studies, provides for the acquisition of comparable competences, - the applicants are transferring from a study programme where at least half of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) requirements from the study programme from which they are transferring and which relate to compulsory courses from another study programme, may be recognised according to the recognition criteria, - the applicants have completed the study programme from which they are transferring. In accordance with the organisational rules or the relevant by-laws, this decision is taken by the Vice-Dean competent for the field of study.

## Conditions for completing the studies

Students complete their studies when they have fulfilled all the prescribed obligations of 120 credits from the course syllabus or recognised obligations.

### The main objectives of the programme

The European Studies programme aims to provide students with:

1. a multi-faceted understanding of European integration and how the EU works in the world,
2. application, synthesis, critical evaluation of theoretical concepts and empirical approaches,
3. professional articulation of skills in the European working language, and transfer to the workplace

At the same time, the programme aims to ensure that the Master's student is able to articulate this knowledge clearly and professionally in written and verbal expression in more than one European language, and to transfer it to the workplace. By delivering these objectives, we increase the chances of Master's graduates gaining employment in the local-regional, national, European or global labour market. Furthermore, the aim of the programme is to provide the Master's graduate with a study background such that, if motivated to continue

his/her studies, he/she will be able to continue his/her studies in the 3rd cycle, either in the more in-depth aspects of European Studies, or in the broader spectrum of specific disciplines/programmes related to European Studies.

The first generation of students are fully employed, according to alumni members, and according to data collected by the Chair of International Relations through alumni, about two thirds of them work in the public sector and about one third in the private sector (about 40% of them are currently working abroad).

The key substantive learning outcomes are:

1. Students understand and can apply theories of European integration to the analysis of (current) European problems,
2. Students understand and compare the functioning, decision-making processes and impact of different European policies on the development of the EU,
3. Students analyse, synthesise and critically evaluate the processes of European economic integration, economic policy and the EU's performance in the global economy,
4. Students interpret and critically evaluate the institutional set-up of the European Union and all phases of its political process, are able to analyse individual EU public policies, anticipate the effects of policies, and are able to plan and prescribe policies,
5. Students are able to explain social relations and processes in Europe through an understanding of the dynamics between social groups that transcend national borders and the political governance of states and international organisations in Europe,
6. Students acquire the ability to observe and interpret the cultural dimension of Europe's phenomenon, in particular its dynamic relationship with the Balkans, and master the debate on the development and meaning of multiculturalism in Europe or the global social community,
7. Students will be able to analyse, synthesise and critically evaluate the changing role of the European Union in the world, particularly in the areas of diplomatic and security efforts in foreign policy, in a theoretical and application-oriented manner,
8. Students apply in-depth theoretical and conceptual tools from different social science fields, and are able to work in an interdisciplinary environment,
9. Students communicate competently and eloquently in their own language and in foreign languages on the basis of appropriate professional terminology, including the use of these languages for the preparation of written submissions, SWOT analyses, development reports, diplomatic notes, expert reports, trade and investment profiles, foreign policy analyses, academic essays, policy papers, a country's negotiating position, a resolution draft, a decision draft, a directive draft, etc., the drafting of minutes, rules of procedure, the drafting of scenarios, and verbal communication in the form of international negotiations.
- 10 Students are able to work in an intercultural environment.
11. Design and implementation of their own 60-page scientific research.

2nd cycle graduates have a combination of up-to-date practical skills in individual and group problem-solving, in-depth methodological and scientific research skills, advanced scientific writing and verbal communication of research based on the use of information and communication technology, negotiation skills in a multicultural environment, proficiency in foreign professional languages and familiarity with project management.

Advancing to a higher year of study is possible with at least 52 credits in the current year (without a special application). However, in exceptional circumstances (as defined in the UL Statute), students who have accrued at least 44 credits in the current year of study may be admitted to the higher year of study on the basis of an approved application.

## Conditions for transferring between programmes

Transfers between programmes are governed by the applicable laws and regulations. The decision on the transfer shall be based on the application, the student's written request, the certificate of the fulfilment of the study obligations of the studies up to the time of application and the approved syllabuses of the courses, whereby the following criteria shall be taken into account: - the meeting of conditions for enrolment in the study programme, - the number of available places for enrolment, - the applicants are transferring from a study programme which, at the end of their studies, provides for the acquisition of comparable competences, - the applicants are transferring from a study programme where at least half of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) requirements from the study programme from which they are transferring and which relate to compulsory courses from another study programme, may be recognised according to the recognition criteria, - the applicants have completed the study programme from which they are transferring, in accordance with the organisational rules or relevant by-laws. This decision is taken by the Vice-Dean competent for the field of study.

The borders of nation states are rapidly blurring in the processes of globalisation, with more and more segments of social action taking place across national borders. With a broad social science background and an understanding of the international environment (through an excellent knowledge and understanding of the actors, the processes and relationships between them, the objective factors and norms that guide actors' actions) and of how they operate within it at different levels (global, regional, sub-regional, bilateral, national and local) in different domains (economic, security, political, diplomatic), the graduates of the Master's study programme in International Relations will be excellent practitioners of these processes.

The key learning outcomes of the programme are:

1. The student masters the in-depth theoretical and methodological tools of the discipline of International Relations, and uses them for the purpose of competent data collection, analysis and critical evaluation of international relations;
2. The student analyses, synthesises and evaluates the role of the economic factor in international relations by analysing and assessing the realities of the Sustainable Development Goals, simulating budgeting and analysing/planning business strategies of companies;
3. The student classifies the sources and objects of international law, knows and understands the process of international norm-making and analyses international law jurisprudence, and, on the basis of this extensive background knowledge, analyses developments in practice and assesses what is and is not in conformity with international law, especially in the field of minority rights and the management of ethnic diversity;
4. The student classifies, analyses and evaluates the strength and impact of the activities of the courses of international relations in the regime of international governance, understands the functioning of international institutions, their capacities and limitations, especially in the field of international finance and international development;
5. The student has in-depth conceptual and applied knowledge in the field of the chosen module; or in the field of diplomacy or selected topics in international politics (regionalism and conflict management);
6. The student is fluent in written and verbal professional terminology in his/her own language and in foreign languages;
7. The student is able to communicate professionally both in the form of short individual and group public presentations, as well as in the form of complex short and longer research and analytical papers (trade and investment profile, foreign policy analysis, SWOT analysis, development report, research report, scientific essay, legal opinion, policy paper, country's negotiating position, negotiation report, dossier, memo, resolution draft, decision draft, directive draft, etc., minutes, drafting of rules of procedure, etc.) and in the form of negotiation;

- the creation of a profile of a political scientist (political theory and globalisation and strategic studies), - the creation of specific sub-profiles linked to the programme, which allows for a large number of elective courses, - the acquisition and deepening of theoretical knowledge in the field of the fundamental notions and concepts of political science, and the deepening of knowledge of the fundamental trends in the history of political thought, - deepening methodological knowledge and learning to apply methods of research and analysis, - deepening the ability to communicate and write in a foreign professional language, - competence in written and verbal expression The programme provides graduates with the

knowledge, skills and competences agreed at European level between political science associations for the degree of Master's Graduate in Political Science.

### General competences (learning outcomes)

The Master's graduate has the knowledge, skills and competences agreed at European level between political studies associations for the degree of Master's Graduate in Political Science. General competences acquired through the programme: The graduate is able to use a variety of research methods and analyse situations, describe them and present them to the public in written and verbal form. The programme provides in-depth skills in expressing himself/herself professionally in writing, is able to precisely formulate professional ideas in various forms, to make advanced public speeches, to lead and participate in debates, to work in a group, to work analytically on his/her own, and to use state-of-the-art technical and electronic means; Has the ability to work in an interdisciplinary team, understands social, political and professional diversity and multiculturalism, is able to apply knowledge in practical situations, including the ability to adapt to new situations and the ability to learn, is able to reflect and self-criticise, and to express himself/herself in writing and verbally in Slovene and, for easier subjects, also in English.

### Course-specific competences (learning outcomes)

The subject-specific competences of the Master's graduate are related to the content, forms of work, teaching methods and study results of each subject and are reflected in the curricula of the subjects. - ability to identify political science content, actors and doctrines,

- ability to analyse complex political situations,
- ability to analyse complex political power relations, doctrinal relationships and the relationships between actors at local, national and global levels,
- establishing international professional networks that enable students to connect globally.

The Master's study programme in Political Science - Political Theory, Globalisation and Strategic Studies is open to students who have completed: a study programme of at least undergraduate level, evaluated by at least 180 credits in any field of study, or for candidates in all fields of study or an equivalent study programme obtained in accordance with the existing regulations in the Republic of Slovenia or abroad.

## Selection criteria in the event of restricted enrolment

In the event of restricted enrolment, the selection of candidates is based on their success in the undergraduate studies (average grade).

## Criteria for the recognition of knowledge and skills acquired before enrolment in the programme

The study programme may recognise knowledge acquired through formal, non-formal or experiential learning, which may be recognised as part of the fulfilled study obligation. Recognition is based on certificates and other relevant documents or supporting documents. ## Grading methods

The grading methods comply with the [UL Statute](#) and are specified in the syllabuses.

## Conditions for advancing through the programme

Advancing to a higher year of study is possible with at least 50 credits in the first year of study (without a special application). However, in exceptional circumstances (as defined in the UL Statute), students who have completed at least 45 credits in the first year of study may be admitted to the higher year of study on the basis of an approved application.

## Conditions for transferring between programmes

Transfers between programmes are governed by the applicable laws and regulations. The decision on the transfer shall be based on the application, the student's written request, the certificate of the fulfilment of the study obligations of the studies up to the time of application and the approved syllabuses of the courses, whereby the following criteria shall be taken into account: - the meeting of conditions for enrolment in the study programme, - the number of available places for enrolment, - the applicants are transferring from a study programme which, at the end of their studies, provides for the acquisition of comparable competences, - the applicants are transferring from a study programme where at least half of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) requirements from the study programme from which they are transferring and which relate to compulsory courses from another study programme, may be recognised according to the recognition criteria, - the applicants have completed the study

programme from which they are transferring, in accordance with the organisational rules or relevant by-laws. This decision is taken by the Vice-Dean competent for the field of study.

### Conditions for completing the studies

Students complete their studies when they have fulfilled all the prescribed obligations of 120 credits from the course syllabus or recognised obligations.

### Conditions for completion of the individual parts of the programme, if contained in the programme

The programme does not contain any parts that can be completed individually.
